

College Institutional Distinctiveness:

Our college has played a pivotal role in providing educational opportunities to the rural areas surrounding it. One of the major areas in which the college is showing distinctiveness is “Cocurricular activities”. The College has completed 53 years of its existence by promoting academics, sports and other cocurricular activities in the field of education and by imparting knowledge to the first generation learners of rural areas. The cocurricular activities like Sports, Fine Arts, Debates, Soft Skills and Computer Literacy Programmes orient the students towards the overall development.

Fine Arts Association of the institution functions effectively. Annual fine arts week motivates the students in classical and folk music, classical and folk dance, enacting dramas in mother tongue, and English. Every year, it conducts various competitions like music, dance and drama and prizes are given. The association selects the best performers and sends them to inter collegiate and inter university competitions. The Physical Education Department conducts sports and games competition every year and prizes are awarded. Separate competitions are conducted for the differently abled persons to encourage their participation and not to feel isolated. Various competitions like quiz, oratorical, essay, debate, painting, drawing, rangoli, creation of the best out of the waste, cooking without fire, etc are conducted by various Departments.

The TANSCHS soft skill centre has been conducted in our college from the academic year 2015-2016. The soft skill classes are well organized and conducted by a team of members. Third year UG students are benefited by this programme. Soft skill trainers teach various topics like communication skills, public speaking, CV writing, letters and E – Mails.

The Department of English and Tamil conduct Rotary Club Rolling Shield Debate and Saraswathi Balakrishnan Rolling Shield Debate respectively every year to enable the students to analyze the given topic in different angles and argue effectively to persuade the audience. Departments conduct debates/oratorical contests/essay writing on women empowerment and women’s role in society. Social responsibility, gender sensitization, national and environmental consciousness are imbibed through several programs conducted by various clubs of our College.

Computer Literacy Programme (CLP) was introduced during the year 1999-2000. It was initiated by the Government of Tamil Nadu in all Government Colleges to enrich all under graduate non-Computer Science students. This is a Government recognized Certificate Programme for which the syllabus was framed by the Directorate of Collegiate Education. Computer Education is available for all UG students in the college, in view of its importance in every walk of life. This training offers wide scope for their employment as the students hail from the rural areas. This Programme is effectively functioning in our college.
